2023 Camp Summary

We have had an exciting and busy year. We started off the camp season this year early with our Father/Daughter weekend in the spring. Our Father/Daughter weekend is a special time for our camp dad's and their daughters to come and grow in their relationship with the Lord as well as draw closer to each other. It's a great way for dads and daughters to foster a strong relationship focused on Christ. It is also a time for the dads and daughters to have a lot of fun together. This year our theme for the weekend was Medieval Quests. The dad and daughter pairs had to learn how to scale walls (Climbing wall), building fortresses (build a shelter out of materials found in nature), navigate the moat (collect rubber ducks in the paddle boats and the lake), and learn how to wear armor (relay clothing race). These were only some of the tasks and activities the pairs participated in. We also had our traditional father/daughter dance on Saturday night. The spiritual focus for the weekend was the armor of God (Ephesians 6:10-17)





This summer our theme for camp was "Be Still and Know" using theme Psalm 46:10:

"Be still and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations. I will be exalted in the earth"

We focused on trusting God and not relying on our own strength. We took the word "still" and used it to guide our week.

At registration this year, we had campers put stickers on maps. One reason was to preview where our campers and staff live that attend camp in light of the name change. On the other map we asked campers to put a sticker on the location on the globe of where they were born. It was amazing to see how diverse our campers are. **We had campers from Asia, Middle East, Africa, Canada, and of course around the United States**. A few years ago, the board prayed and earnestly sought how we could be a more diverse camp. This prayer was answered this year by having so many different cultures and countries represented. It truly was amazing to see God's Word being shared in different languages and to so many different cultures.

Financial Update

We held our seventh annual golf outing and fundraiser in June at Moccasin Run Golf Course presented by Element Risk Management. This year we did not advertise the partnership with the

Parkesburg point, and still had 96 registered golfers. We had 28 different business sponsors, 10 of which were brand new. Special THANK YOU to Mark Landis from Metro Insurance and Financial Services, and Legacy of Love for the support helping to organize the event. All together, we made over \$13,000 for camp! Speaking of camp, we had nine of our business sponsors and community partners join us to visit camp this year and see what we do with our campers! Outside of camp, we made a very strong connection with The Justamere Foundation and Lori Cushman, that resulted in a \$15,000 grant towards our CILT Program.



God has blessed us financially by always providing for our needs. We strive to keep our camper costs as low as possible so that many families can afford to send their children to camp. However, **our camper fees do not cover the cost of camp.** We rely on donors and ministry partners who give financially to help us continue to keep camp cost affordable as well as to provide activities and supplies for our campers and staff. Our camp cost has increased over the past few years especially as we have moved to a different location. However, we did not raise our rates for 2023. As a result, we did not finish the camp year as financially strong as we would have liked. We are in the process of examining our budget to reevaluate our rates. **We try to keep our rates low so that as many families as possible can afford camp**.

Your gift goes so much farther than just what happens at camp. We have missionaries that are able to follow up with some of our campers that came internationally. Those campers hope to attend next year.
